Meet the McCuistions

Music, wheat, giving. These three words pretty well sum up Willie McCuistion's life. Add Fran Davison McCuistion to that equation and you have a lively and rewarding mix.

The fifth of seven children, Willie loved farm life along the Arkansas River near Fowler, CO, east of Pueblo. He also loves athletics, filling his high school years with football, baseball and more. In fact, he loved sports so much he decided to be a coach. Then he got his first job—with crop research. From that day on, he was engrossed with small grains, primarily wheat.

After University graduation and marriage, Willie worked in mountain meadow research in Western CO. Fran worked at secretarial/administration jobs.

Five years of graduate school at Oklahoma State provided Willie with international training in cereal breeding. Fran supported this venture by typing theses and working as a secretary.

In 1967 Willie, Fran and two young sons (Kevin, 3 1/2; & Michael, 10 months) headed for India with the Rockefeller Foundation. "This was the beginning of the green revolution," Willie said. "India and Pakistan wanted to become self-sufficient in wheat." Ten months later Willie was called to direct an accelerated wheat and barley breeding and genetics program in Tunisia, North Africa.

From there the McCuistions went to Algeria to direct a similar program before returning to the States in 1975 to give their two children American roots.

Twelve years later, with their children grown, they moved to Egypt where Willie was an Interdisciplinary Research Advisor for the Agricultural Research Center. Willie is adamant about it being "Fran's commitment, resilience and adaptability to foreign living that made it possible for them to live 16 years in developing countries overseas."

Fran grew up with eight siblings in Walsenburg, CO. In sixth grade the family moved to Lao Animas.



When it came time for college, Pop Biggs, a friend of the family, offered to pay Fran's way through college. Fran told him, "No, I could never pay you back."

"Just pass it on," was his response. And that's what Fran and Willie have tried to do over the years. Giving to others is their greatest passion.

It was while in Egypt that Fran started making jewelry. Fran loves to interact with women through making gifts of jewelry for them. She also donates large quantities of jewelry each year to Samaritan Purse and other benevolent agencies.

After eight years in Egypt, the McCuistions "retired" and came home. For the next nine years Willie did short-term consulting overseas (Albania, China, Egypt . . .)

Then there's the music part of this couple's life. Willie's a man with a song in his heart. That smooth tenor voice is so easy to listen to. And Fran's lilt-ing laugh makes life a little brighter for all of us.

Four grandchildren in Washington and Oregon help keep the McCuistions busy during the summer months, but how did these world sojourners end up spending their winters at RCE? Invited to Tucson by friends, Willie and Fran stayed at RCE and were greatly impressed by the friendliness and helpfulness of the park ambassadors. The result: the McCuistions have returned for 10 years and have become ambassadors themselves in order to "pass it on."

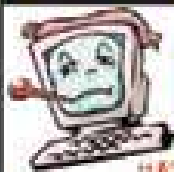
