# From The Office

Traffic in the park is currently at a high level. We would like to remind bike riders that they are under the same rules as cars.....stop at the stop signs and keep it under 10 mph. We had a near collision at the gate recently where a bike did not stop crossing the blvd and was nearly hit by an incoming car. Also a reminder to all walkers, you should walk FACING traffic and please be considerate and move over when a car is approaching. Let's all work together to make this the greatest park around as well as a safe park.

We are fortunate to have a lot of visitors at this time. We would encourage you to have your visitors be careful when they park on the street, that they do not block the neighbor's driveway. Reminder: There is no overnight parking on the streets. We also appreciate all visitors (overnight) being registered in the office – there is a small charge and we will give you a parking permit for your vehicle. Remember – no parking on empty lots – the vehicle WILL be ticketed.

The pet gate at the north end of the park has been left open when residents take a walk into the wash. **This gate is to remain locked at ALL times.** Please remember to take your pet gate key and lock the gate behind you.

There have been a number of questions about sub rents in the park. If you will come to the office we will be glad to explain the rules and charges. We have paperwork to fill out indicating who pays the electric. Mothers, Fathers, Sons and Daughters may stay in your unit without a sub rent fee. These are the only relatives that are exempt from the sub rent fee.

Spring is nearly here and residents and Rv's will be headed home. Now is the time to reserve your spot for next year. Remember, there will be no rate change for next year, so reserve early! AND remember our Refer A Friend program. If you refer an RV'er (that has not been here before or for the last three years) and they stay a week – you both get a \$20 credit.

If they stay a month, you both get a \$100 credit. Get several new visitors to register and you can put a goodly amount of credit on your account. Come to the office for rules and flyers.

A number of cats have been reported roaming the park. Residents who have indoor cats MUST keep them indoors at all time. If you live in the pet section, you may take your cat out but it must be on a leash.

We would like to publicly thank our great maintenance crew that has battled broken water lines and leaks, way into the cold night. At the time of this writing some areas of Pima County still are without water. Tell them you appreciate the hard work they do! That includes Bea who keeps our facility clean as well.

# Medical News You Can Use

## HERBALS & WARFARIN (COUMADIN)

A number of common supplements – both herbal and non-herbal – are known to interact with the prescription medication warfarin (Coumadin) in ways that may affect the effectiveness and/or safety of the drug. Warfarin is a widely used prescription blood-thinning medication commonly prescribed for people who have an increased risk for blood clots, such as those who have heart arrhythmias, or a history of heart attack, heart valve replacement, or blood clots in the veins or lungs. It is a potentially high-risk medication that must be carefully managed, and it is very important that patients report to their doctors all the medications and supplements they are taking, including vitamins and herbals.

Researchers reviewed the effects on clotting and bleeding of 20 of the most popular herbal supplements, and 20 of the most popular non-herbal supplements. They found that more than half of the products interacted with warfarin, and 35% significantly changed measures of blood clotting, according to a paper presented at the 2010 annual meeting of the Heart Rhythm Society.

The researchers found that popular supplements such as cranberry, ginkgo biloba, saw palmetto, ginger, and garlic are associated with increased rates of bleeding. They found that glucosamine/chondroitin, multi-herb products, evening primrose oil, and essential fatty acids can increase the amount of time it takes for blood to clot (effectively thinning the blood), and supplements such as St. John's wort, coenzyme Q10, melatonin, ginseng, and soy can decrease the amount of time. Changes in clotting times can affect the effectiveness of warfarin, and require adjustments in warfarin dosage.

If you are taking supplements of any kind, be sure to inform your doctor. Herbal and non-herbal supplements are drugs, even though they are available without a prescription, and they may cause potentially dangerous consequences when mixed with warfarin and other medications.

There are also certain foods that interfere with the effectiveness of warfarin. Do your research.

# Blood Drive

Local Red Cross calling for 300 more blood donors to help nation's blood supply recover from effects of severe winter weather .

Communities slammed with severe winter weather are looking to Arizona and other states that escaped the worst of the snow storms to help them rebuild the nation's blood supply.

A series of storms since January 1 has caused the cancellation of more than 850 Red Cross blood drives and a shortfall of more than 32,000 blood donations nationwide. Earlier this month, the Arizona Blood Services Region of the American Red Cross had three drives cancelled and was unable to collect 145 units of blood due to several evenings of sub-freezing temperatures.

"The Red Cross distributes blood nationwide, so even though the Arizona Blood Services Region was only slightly affected by the winter storms, our support can help those who were more seriously affected," said Darrin Greenlee, CEO for the Arizona Blood Services Region of the American Red Cross.

"We are looking for 300 more donors beyond our normal turnout to donate blood in the next two weeks at the **Tucson donor centers**," said Greenlee. "Three hundred is the number of extra donors that we anticipate we can accommodate, and still honor in a timely manner the appointments of those who have already scheduled a donation," he said.

All blood types are needed, but there is a special need for donors with O-Negative and B-Negative blood.

The Red Cross distributes blood products to approximately 3,000 hospitals and transfusion centers across the United States. People across the nation have been responding to the call for blood donors, and the Red Cross is grateful to those who are stepping up to donate blood to help the blood supply recover and return to sufficient levels.

## How to Donate Blood

Persons who meet weight and height requirements (110 pounds or more, depending on their height) and who are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. Persons who are 16 and 17 years of age must have parental consent. Please bring your Red Cross blood donor card or other form of positive ID when you come to donate.

## About the American Red Cross

The Arizona Blood Services Region serves the state of Arizona and needs to collect about 300 units of blood a day to meet patient needs in 26 hospitals. The Red Cross is a charitable organization—not a government agency—and depends on volunteers and the generosity of the American public to perform its mission.
