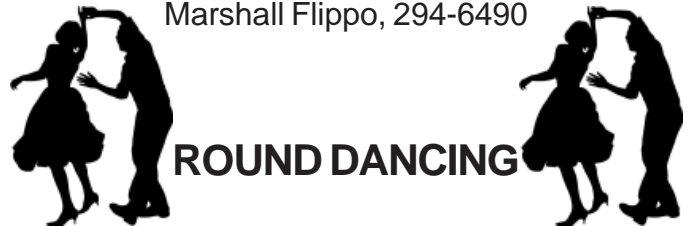

STRETCHING

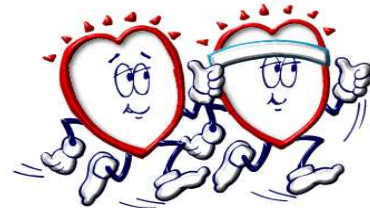

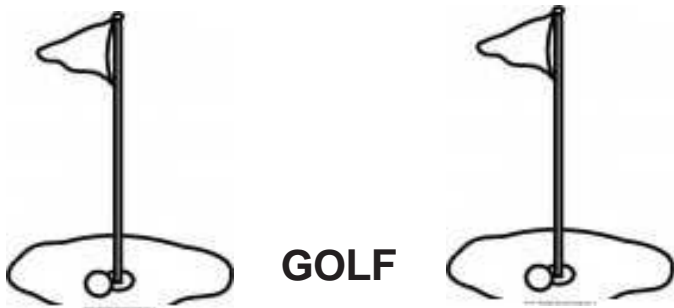
