George has served on the Board of Director of the ARVC organization and is a past President of the State Chapter. One of his main goals is to give you a wonderful RVing experience.

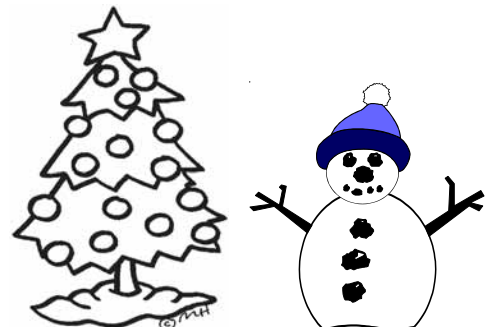

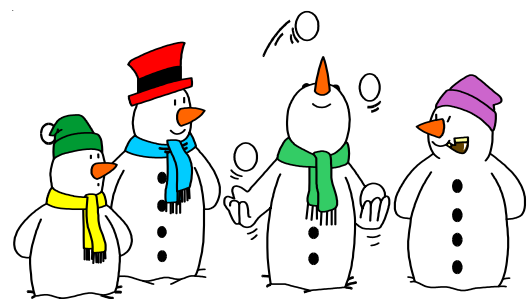
The first meeting will be held Wednesday, December 10, 2008 at 10:00 AM.

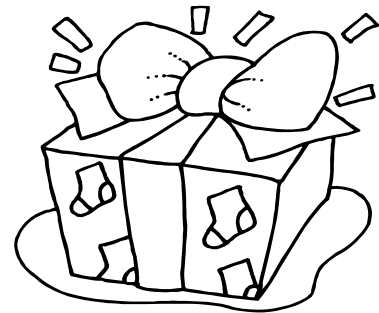
