



when you are walking at night, keep pets on a leash, and remain alert to an unlikely, but possible encounter.


New to Tucson or **Rincon Country West?**

- o Wearing gloves and changing gloves often.
- o Using sterile collection sets and an antiseptic scrub for every donation.

There's currently an urgent need for O-negative blood donations.

In an emergency, doctors reach for O-negative first when there's no time to determine a patient's blood type.

O-negative is the universal blood type – it can be transfused to all patients.

O-negative donors can double their impact by giving a power red donation. One donation can help save multiple lives.

As the pandemic continues, **convalescent plasma donations are also needed** now to help patients currently battling this disease. Plasma from those who've recovered from COVID-19, known as convalescent plasma, contains antibodies that could be used to treat patients with an active, severe COVID-19 case to give them an extra boost to fight their illness.
