## WORDS FROM GEORGE



A belated Happy Thanksgiving and a very Merry Christmas to all from the O'Leary family, young and old. Fifty years ago I came to Tucson to build a 550 space mobile home park on Tucson's east side, Rincon Country Mobile Home Park, then return to St. Paul Minnesota the following spring. You all know as to what is said about the best laid plans of mice and men. It happened to my partners and I. I won't bother you with the details but I have been here ever since.

Since arriving in the Old Pueblo, in addition to building one mobile home park and two RV parks containing more than 2100 spaces, I have built a 150 space RV park for Tucson Meadows on Tucson's east side also a big addition to a mobile home park in Tucson's northwest side. The name escapes me as I write this Word From George for December 2020 after all these years. I better get back to business as to some of the improvements we made this last summer.

During the summer, in an attempt to avoid shutting off the water system to the entire resort every time we have a water break, my crew and I plus my trusty old Case backhoe installed 42 new gate valves on the water mains in the section on both sides of the Boulevard. The valves ranged in size from 6 inches down to 2 inches over one-third of these valves were new additions. We can now shut down one section on either side of the boulevard and leave the rest of the park in service while repairing a water leak. Sorry I did not do that long ago.

Nearly every improvement that we made this past summer is visible. Let's take a look at the poor shape of the four Pickleball courts that were constructed during the summer of 2015. The players kept reminding me constantly the last couple of years as to how poor the courts were. This year I decided to redo all four. I quickly found out why the surface deteriorated so rapidly. I paid for eight inches of ABC base in 2015. When I tried to save some of the AB for the new courts, I found no more than a two inch depth of base, sometimes less. Likewise the black top surface was no more than one and one-quarter inch thick, not the two inches I paid for. Everything done to upgrade the courts was done by me and my maintenance staff with the one-time help from Lee's Paving in removing material. The concrete pouring was done by our regular guy, Concrete Joe and his crew. By doing the job ourselves, I saved tens of thousands of dollars versus hiring contractors. You, my dear residents, are the beneficiaries of my frugal ways. I had the job completed by October 11 in time for opening day.

Another major item we did this past season was the seal coating of all of the streets in the RV section except for A Street on the north side. Another major replacement I had done this past summer was to replace the primary electric 15 kva cable from the distribution cabinet by the post office to Transformers T, R and W. This work will ensure reliable power for 20 or 30 years to come.

Lastly, the Chinese virus has done a number on activities in RCW this season. We have changed our activity schedule, hopefully for this season only. Please comply with all the posted regulations in and around all the facilities.

It is with a wee bit of pride, I also offer you this. During January and February last, my 16 year old grand nephew, George O'Leary (Georgie) stayed with me as part of a transition year of school from Junior to Senior grade. He worked in the office and with Nate in the maintenance department. I just found out Georgie is this year's Winner of the Young Economist of the Year 2020 through his school, Glenstal Abbey. He won a trophy and the unique chance to have a virtual Zoom meeting with the Irish minister of finance, Paschal O'Donohoe (the equivalent of Secretary of the Treasury Janet Yellen.) What a future this young man has ahead of him!

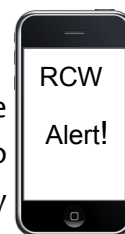
## New to Tucson or Rincon Country West?

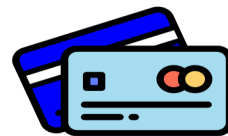

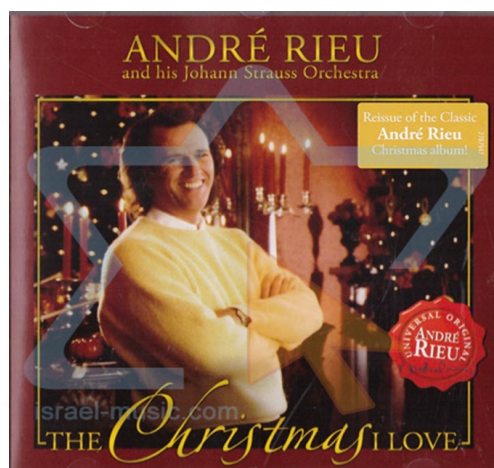

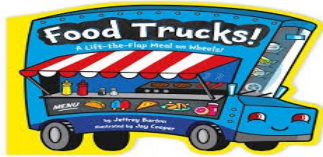
