A Word from George

Revitalizing Your Park Models

Rincon Country West is now 35 years old. Like many of us we need a little uplift as we approach midlife. For the past 3 to 5 years I have made many improvements and upgrades to our Park and our facilities.

Some of the park model units in RCW are in urgent need of a facelift. I put a notice in A Word from George one year ago but many of you paid little heed to my request. Some of you on the other hand complied by doing some great upgrades. Thank you so very much.

By the time you read this we will have done a Park wide inspection of park models informing you of what you need to do to upgrade the outside appearance of your park model. In the interests of all those that spend big bucks for new park models or expensive motorhomes and fifth wheel units it is only fair to these renters that they are indeed spending the winter in a 10/10/10 rated National Park of the Year in which we are were awarded just 14 months ago.

Park Models for Sale

I want to say a few words about our park model rental program. Currently, at RCW we have 50 rental units. Annette tells me we could rent 10 more for the winter if we had them. We need to sell some of the remodeled units that look like new inside and outside with the complete renovation on the interior and exterior. Some have a new Arizona room added and some just have a deck added. My hope is to have all rental units no more than five years old in the near future. Here's your opportunity to get into an almost new park model unit at a very fair price. Just make us an offer. You can find a list of rental units for sale in the office or online.

Just inside the Back-Office door to your left from the parking lot side of the building the sales office will be open for your information after coffee on Friday and Saturday mornings from 9:00 AM until 3:00 PM. If you live in one of our rental units, presently, you have first rights as a buyer. Just come in and make us an offer, you might be surprised.

Park Improvements

RCW and RCE are family owned RV Resorts. This is much better for your pocketbook when it comes to our rental rate for comparable resorts. The many costly improvements we made during the last three years or so are listed below just in case you forgot.

1. This past summer, we added two new classrooms totaling 1750 sq. ft to accommodate the needs of our growing population. The rooms are being used for our quilters and other functions. I have been inundated with "Thank you's" for the new building.


- 2. Two years ago, we added a new exercise facility with up to date equipment as well as an exercise studio.
- 3. We doubled the size of the woodshop plus we installed a state-of-the-art dust collection system as well as providing 200-amp electrical service directly from Transformer K and 240-volt system to the facility as needed.
- 4. K Street, by the post office, received a new gutter and new street as did B Street from the Boulevard to the entrance to the new storage yard.
- 5. The new 60 space, numbered, personal car parking lot provided for you on B Street is a new addition to RCW.
- 6. The new 105 space RV Storage Parking area provided for you to park your motorhomes, fifth wheels and trailers as many of you park model owners do. Also, those of you that like to come down to Tucson each winter find it reasonable to leave your rig here for the summer compared to driving 2000 miles to get here and another 2000 miles to drive back home. It's cheaper to leave it here in our parking area secured by an 8-foot wrought iron fence around the perimeter.
- 7. This time last year the primary power line from the distribution cabinet by the post office to Transformer W on Lot #880 went kaput. We quickly found the break and got you back in service in fast time. Initially, when the park was built all of our transformers were served by direct burial primary cable. During the last 10 years, every time we resurface the street or installed a gutter in the center of the street, I installed conduit to carry future primary electric cable. Last summer, with the help of Sturgeon Electric we installed primary cable to every transformer in the RV section, except one to be done soon after you leave us this spring.
- 8. Late last season, I was advised by our primary electric contractor, Sturgeon Electric that our switchgear unit could quit at any moment without notice. The switchgear is where Tucson Electric Power Company connects their service to the park down by the tennis court. If the switchgear had quit it would leave every unit and every building without power. I ordered a new unit while you were still here last spring. Getting a new unit involved the manufacturer, the wholesale distributor, my RCW electrical engineer, Sturgeon Electric Company, Tucson Electric Power and yours truly to organize and okay everything.
 - It took 174 days from the first discussion with the electric contractor, the manufacturer and yours truly to installation on October 24 last. You might ask yourself "why do I need to know this information". Now you know things just don't happen, we prepare whenever we can to prevent outages. Another two generations of RVers will be enjoying a 10/10/10 National Park of the Year. Hopefully, under the guidance of the next generation of O'Leary's. My son, Danny O'Leary currently manages Rincon Country East.

Thank you for listening to my explanation of how things are kept in tip top shape for your pleasure and enjoyment. I have devoted 50 years of my life to two generations of RVers starting with overflow from my friends at Far Horizons in 1972. I had 120 RV lots of my own in 1976 in my 500 space Rincon Country Mobile Home Park on Tucson's Eastside next to Rincon Country East.

I enjoy working, running my backhoe and creating a new and better community for our residents. All with the help of my maintenance manager, Nate and my outdoor crew. I was very lucky to have Nate join us a year ago. By the time you read this Word from George I will be less than a month away from my 89th birthday. I thank the good Lord for the fact that I have little or no pain. Thankfully the head is still okay and will be for a while longer.

Plans for 2020

- Next summer we have plans to seal coat all the streets in the RV section.
- "A" Street will have a new gutter and all new blacktop from the Boulevard to at least "G" Street.
- We are working with CenturyLink to bring in a fiber internet line over the summer to increase
 the capacity for connections and to upgrade the DSL internet speeds for residents. This will
 help alleviate the maxed capacity presently being experienced.
- The pickleball courts with the blacktop surface will be completely renovated and replaced with concrete. Due to the tight surroundings there is no room for expansion.

Rincon Country RV Resort's pet policy states that all pets must be kept under control at all times and on a leash. A 6-foot leash is recommended for the following reasons:

- 1. Your dog could run in front of a car or bicycle on our busy roads with blind corners.
- 2. Your dog could tangle with a not so friendly neighbor dog.
- 3. Your dog is more likely to be injured by bolting and hurting its neck or by getting tangled in the leash.
- 4. Owners are at risk of being injured by rope burn or falls.
- 5. Retractable leashes are especially dangerous for both dog and owner.

In November 1974, Gary Tenen and Randy Tufts were exploring the limestone hills at the eastern base of the Whetstone Mountains. They were looking "for a cave no one had ever found" and found it. The two kept the cave a secret until February 1978 when they told the property owners, James and Lois Kartchner, about their awesome discovery. Since unprotected caves can be seriously damaged by unregulated use, they knew the cave had to be protected. Tenen and Tufts spent several years looking into the possibility of developing the cave themselves. Some members of the Kartchner family lived in Tucson and were very impressed with the development and operation of Catalina State Park by Arizona State Parks. They decided to approach State Parks to see if the agency was interested in acquiring this outstanding resource.
