Farmers markets contribute about \$9 billion to the U.S. economy every year, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). The Farmers Market Coalition (FMC) says that the number of farmers markets in the U.S. has grown from just under 2,000 in 1994 to more than 8,600 today.

It is also apparent here at RCW you don't have to be a farmer or food producer to participate, artisans, selling items like soap, candles, jewelry, pottery, services and more. The sense of community they create by sharing their passions and talent is incredible. They have incorporated the restriction and guidelines to keep themselves and our residents safe.

Irish gent parks his dream here

It's a long way from Tipperary to Tucson, but George O'Leary has found his American dream — building a trailer park on the southeast side.

O'Leary, 47, grew up on a small farm near Tipperary and came to the United States in 1957 with "no regrets." He still looks over his shoulder and keeps a corner of his heart open for the Emerald Isle, however.

After building the Rincon Country Mobile Home Park from scratch in the nine years he's been in Tucson, he has moved next door to 8989 E. Escalante Road, where he's putting in a \$2 million park for travel trailers. When it opens in October, it will be the culmination of a lot of hard work.

"I got an opportunity, and I passed the test," he says. "That's the important thing, not the worth of something." He says he loves construction work, which he started doing in Ireland.

"I like to do things," he says. "I don't take two-hour lunches."

O'Leary has become so American that, like many snowbirds who move to Tucson, he still calls someplace else "home." In his case it's Minnesota, where "I spent most of my adult life." But he also still talks as if he'd just stepped off the boat.

"It hasn't done me one bit of harm," he says of his accent.

"When I was growing up, I had a vision of the U.S. as a land of wonderment and enchantment," he says. "I was intrigued."

As a young man about to be married, he had a chance to come to the United States.

"I thought 'If I don't go before I get married, I'll never be able to,' " he says. After he arrived, the Latin saying "Veni, vidi, vici" — "I came, I saw, I conquered" didn't apply to him for a while. "It was a

case of 'Veni, vidi,' but no 'vici' for a long time," he said.

He brought his fiancee, Bridie, over from Ireland and eventually set up a construction business in St. Paul. He later built a trailer park there.

O'Leary says it was just a coincidence he took the oath to become an American citizen on St. Patrick's Day 1965. But there were a few jokes about the 16 inches of snow that fell on him and everybody else when he gave up his allegiance to Ireland that day.

"The good saint was having his share of revenge," he says.

He came to Tucson in 1970 to start Rincon Village. He enjoyed running the park, with its residents coming in from all over the country, but it became more than a full-time job. He sold out last year and looks forward to the seasonal nature of the park he's building.

"When the snowbirds leave, I can go with them, if I feel like it," he says.

It's not just blarney when he talks about the merits of his project, which will have 450 spaces on 27½ acres, and include a recreation center with craft shops, a swimming pool and tennis courts. He's already received reservations from people all over the country and Canada.

O'Leary goes back to Ireland about every year, flies the Irish tricolor on Irish holidays and says he still speaks Gaelic "fairly fluently."

"Any Irishman I meet, I speak first to him in Gaelic," he says. He says he's still proud of his heritage and language, but that doesn't make him any less of an American.

"This country gave me the opportunity to put my God-given talents to work," he says. "We should say a lot more positive things than negative."

Even though I am coming up on my"90th birthday, I'm very fortunate to still have the ability to be the main guy at Rincon Country RV Resorts.

This did not happen by accident. Much of it is attributable to you, our residents, and your understanding and kindness toward me over the past 35 plus years.

It has been a labor of love building and maintaining Rincon Country West to the standard we operate at today.





RCW Field of Dreams Pollinator Garden



The RCW Field of Dreams Pollinator Garden is "growing" quickly!! In the past month, we have added trees throughout the area and designated a corner specifically to at-tract birds and a corner specifically to attract butterflies and especially the Monarch.

In the bird corner, a living ocotillo fence has been planted as a shade structure and to give some definition to the garden. We hope to see some leaves on the ocotillo this year, but will probably not see any flowering until next year. We have planted shrubs that will be dense and grow low to the ground. These will serve as shelter and a nest-ing area. A water feature, donated by a very generous donor, was recently added for the birds to sip, bathe and just to play in. We have also added a hummingbird feeder that is already attracting many beautiful hummers!

In the Monarch corner, we have planted several flowering shrubs that will attract a vari-ety of butterflies. At this time, there are four different species of Arizona native milk-weed. Milkweed is the only plant that hosts the Monarch butterfly, whose numbers have been decreasing in the past decade.

Throughout the garden, we have placed a variety of trees, shrubs, and plants that at-tract many different pollinators - birds, bees, butterflies, bats and other pollinating in-sects. Many of our plants serve as nectar food as well as hosts for laying eggs and for larval food. There are still a number of flowering plants that will be added to finish off the garden.

We have taken a systematic approach in planning the garden. Research has been done in order to make sure residents' donations are not wasted. You have probably witnessed how the garden has been progressing first the space allocation, the ground being dug up and tilled and then the fence being installed. Our Planning and Design sub-committee laid out plans that would best use the space provided. The trees were chosen for their suitability to our garden and placed in the most advantageous location for both summer and winter sun and shade for other plants. The ocotillo fence serves the same purpose for the bird corner. We then chose shrubs that would best serve our needs. Birds need dense, low-to-the-ground shrubs for nesting and safety. Other shrubs and vines were placed along the fence so that, when they grow, they will "hide" the fence with a beautiful covering. The next phase was to begin with plants for specif-ic pollinators, which is where we currently are in our process.

We will now begin purchasing and planting additional plants that will greatly enhance the garden with color, purpose, and suitability. We have begun mulching with wood chips - research of desert locales indicates that mulch is very helpful in preserving wa-ter at the base of each plant. The mulch will eventually decompose and add necessary nutrients to the soil - at that time, we will replace the mulch with new. You will note that, with the exception of the walkways, the entire garden will be covered with wood chip mulch for aesthetic purposes. It will help with the mud during the monsoon sea-son, as well.

Pathways have been roughly laid out with white clothesline. ADA dictates that paths need to be 36" wide. Our paths will be 42" wide and will be formed with crushed stone with "fines." Fines are the dust within the crushed stone. When placed and wetted down, the fines seep down into the crushed stone to make the surface hard. We are choosing this so that anyone in a wheelchair or with a walker or someone a bit un-steady on their feet will be able to walk safely on our garden pathways.

We will be installing a self-watering irrigation system so that the garden will be fairly low-maintenance. Each plant will be watered according to its needs. The irrigation system will also be used to maintain the water level in the fountain that was recently installed near the bird corner.

As you can see, there has been a LOT of work done to research, plan, and begin im-plementing our Pollinator Garden. None of this would have been possible without YOU!! Some of you have provided countless volunteer time in a number of ways and some of you have provided the much needed monetary donations to help make this "Field of Dreams" come true. We cannot thank you enough for your interest and gen-erosity!! Please know that your donations are being used with frugality in mind, yet providing what is needed to make our Pollinator Garden a peaceful haven for all to en-joy! Thank you, Thank you!!!
