Hello Rincon Country East!

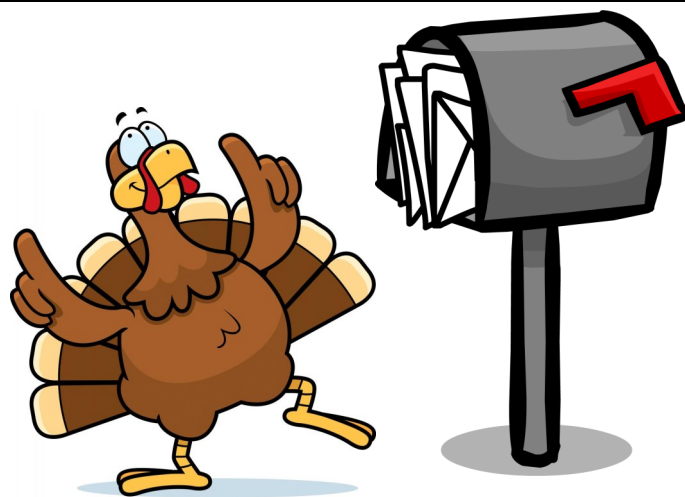
Can you believe it is November already? We are welcoming in that cooler weather for sure and are also welcoming our snowbird guests into the park.

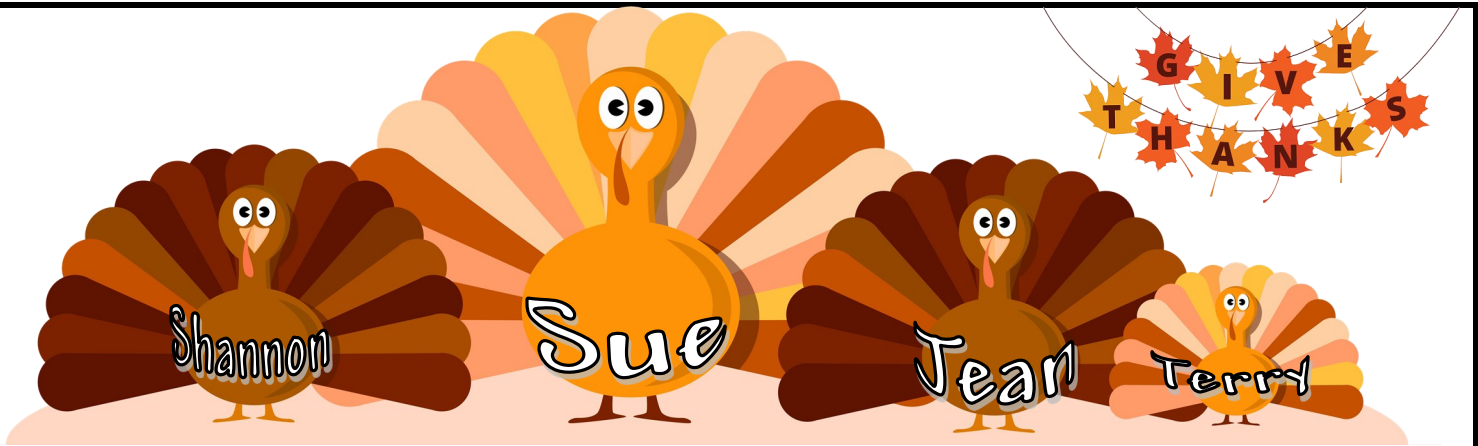
The PO has free Priority Mail boxes that can be taken to the Post Office.

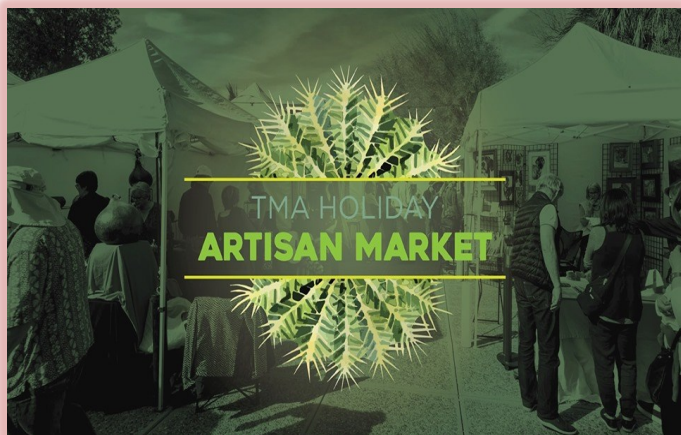

We thank The Hardscrabble Road Band who have donated their time and talents for this awesome cause!



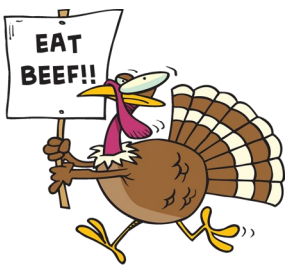
Painting with Karina

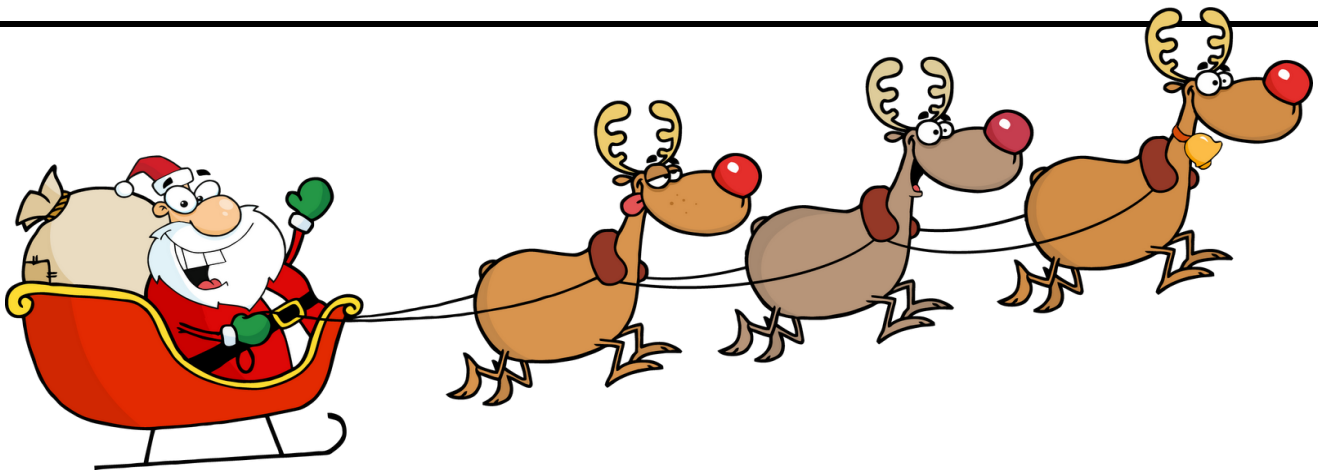
