




Name That Song Quiz

Continuous Chest Compression CPR Course

Great strides have come about in the ability to respond to a cardiac arrest. A new method of CPR increases the number of compressions a responder should administer to a victims chest and is highly effective in saving lives. This method, called continuous chest compression CPR, is recommended by the Save a Heart Center at the University of Arizona and the Tucson Fire Department. CPR results in an increased success rate in saving a victim of cardiac arrest. You will learn how to use the defibrillator and also the choking maneuver.

Course length is one hour. Course of Completion card is issued at end of class.

You must sign up in the Activity Office to ensure you have a place on this course offered.




There's No Place Like Home Dance
