The weather is cooling and this is a time when rattlesnakes might seek the warmth of a cozy asphalt street after sundown.

For maximum safety carry a flashlight when you are walking at night, keep pets on a leash, and remain alert to an unlikely, but possible, encounter.

- All pets must be in the pet section, unless pet is a service animal. Humans, please assume that a pet outside the pet section is a service animal. If there is a concern, please see humans in the Main Office rather than create a confrontation. Humans, please remember pets must be cleaned up after and kept on a leash at all times!

Pima County Will Be Giving a Presentation With Information About The Loop Shared-Use Paths Around Metro Tucson

Friday, November 18 at 10:00 am in Auditorium (following Coffee Hour)


This presentation will offer current information regarding the Huckleberry Loop Trail System and will be given by Joseph Cuffari, Program Manager in the Flood Control Group at Pima County.

Many RCW residents use the Loop and are aware that the Trail System was voted as the Best Recreational Trail System in the United States last year. The content of the presentation will include (among other things) the following information:

- History of the Loop what led up to the initial planning, funding and development.
- Construction methods employed.
- Riverbank stabilization techniques.
- Appropriate mention of the beautiful artwork along the Trail network as well as the Sponsors.
- Design of the trail surface in consideration of high usage levels and temperature extremes.
- Ongoing maintenance procedures.
- Future plans.

Feedback from a "Friends of RCW" Facebook post last year resulted in several additional topics being added to the subjects of interest including:

- Archeological discoveries made during building of the Trail System.
- Interest in knowing if there are portions of the Trail System that are more popular, maybe based on the number of things to see or do.


