#### Friday, November 18 at 10:00 am in Auditorium (following Coffee Hour)


This presentation will offer current information regarding the Huckleberry Loop Trail System and will be given by Joseph Cuffari, Program Manager in the Flood Control Group at Pima County.

Many RCW residents use the Loop and are aware that the Trail System was voted as the Best Recreational Trail System in the United States last year. The content of the presentation will include (among other things) the following information:

- History of the Loop what led up to the initial planning, funding and development.
- Construction methods employed.
- Riverbank stabilization techniques.
- Appropriate mention of the beautiful artwork along the Trail network as well as the Sponsors.
- Design of the trail surface in consideration of high usage levels and temperature extremes.
- Ongoing maintenance procedures.
- Future plans.

- Archeological discoveries made during building of the Trail System.
- Interest in knowing if there are portions of the Trail System that are more popular, maybe based on the number of things to see or do.


