Safety from Wildlife

The weather is cooling and this is a time when rattlesnakes might seek the warmth of a cozy asphalt street after sundown.

For maximum safety carry a flashlight when you are walking at night, keep pets on a leash, and remain alert to an unlikely, but possible, encounter.



#### **Safety Rules and Precautions**

Below is a list of most commonly noted concerns:

- Being in the dark Please carry a flashlight • when walking after dark. If you are biking, please have a light on your bike.
- Going the wrong way Please remember to walk facing traffic and bike with traffic.
- All pets must be on a leash, except in the pet section, unless pet is a service animal. Please assume that a pet outside the pet section is a service animal. If there is a concern, please see the Front Office rather than create a confrontation. Please remember pets must be cleaned up after and kept on a leash at all times!

#### **CURBSIDE COLLECTION**

#### **NOW AVAILABLE**

We are continuing our Curbside Collection program in an effort to:

1.) Eliminate unsightly items left in the Dumpsters areas and

2.) Prevent the Dumpsters from being filled with non-household trash.

Please remember, residents are no longer allowed to leave items on the side of the Dumpsters or dump anything that will not fit inside a trash bag. Anyone caught dumping prohibited items will be in violation of the Rules & Policies of the Resort. We are providing this service as an alternative to residents having to take non-household trash to the landfill themselves.

Rincon Country will pick up, from in front of your unit, large items such as couches, stoves, mattresses, etc. This does not include items with freon such as refrigerators or ACs. Pick-ups start at \$25. Green waste will remain free of charge.

# RECYCLING

#### IF ANY "DO NOT RECYCLE" ITEMS END UP IN THE RECYCLING BIN, THE ENTIRE BIN GOES INTO WASTE AND THE PARK RECEIVES A FINE.

There is a Recycling receptacle located in the resort for self-drop off. Please <u>do not use</u> <u>plastic bags</u> for your recyclables. Our <u>recycle program does not accept plastic bags</u> for recycling. Therefore, they are not permitted in the recycle receptacles even if the bags contain accepted items.

Metal Cans	Food cans made of steel or Tin and empty aerosol cans	<u>NO</u> other metals
Newspaper	Newspapers and all inserts	NO bags or rubber bands
Paper	Computer and writing paper, Junk mail, brown paper grocery Bags, and file folders	<u>NO</u> facial or toilet tissue, paper towels or plates, napkins, gift Wrap, diapers, pet food bags, Fed -Ex or self-sealing envelopes
Plastics	All plastic jugs/bottles with screw-top lids or with a base Larger than its neck	NO plastic bags or cups, clear food containers, styrofoam, motor oil or pool chemical Containers

If garbage bins are full, please wait to deposit your garbage until the next day. Do not leave garbage bags on ground. Ideally take your garbage to bins early on in the week, as bins get picked up five days a week.
