









The inspiration for the club is recalling a "happy place", maybe the one you knew growing up – or might have known if you had the opportunity.

We have created an inviting environment for Rincon Country West residents and guests to relax & watch the trains roll by. There are multiple track loops traversing the layout creating the opportunity for several trains to operate simultaneously: featuring girder bridges spanning between sections of the display. The railroad has been expertly designed so Operators and observers can observe all the action. This garden railroad consists of five separate loops with sidings which are interconnected and have access to a "rail yard" & storage area. There is an undercover bench and an outdoor seating area for observers. The layout is both track and battery powered. The layout is oriented east-west with full southern exposure. The current layout includes plants that tolerate full sun, have a reduced water needs once established, and are not preferred by plant predators.

Not only do we serve our mission through the activities of our railroad club, but work to make a positive difference in the community by supporting Toys for Tots, Community Foundation of AZ, and Gospel Rescue Mission. We know one thing for sure, the more each of us acts as global citizens and become positive agents of change, the better off we all are.

Efforts such as the RCW Garden Railroad Club do not occur in isolation, or through the efforts of only one person. We are grateful to our many friends who have supported the club events like SpudOut, Parking Lot Sale, and Rails in the Garden with Tucson Garden Railway Society.





We are continuing our Curbside Collection program in an effort to:


