Recap from the Tucson Fire Department presentation from the Friday Morning Coffee & Donut Program.

- > Know the area hospitals. The closest are St. Mary's Hospital, Banner Main and Banner South. It would be helpful if residents check to see what hospitals will accept your insurance.
- > Using the Urgent Cares on Irvington and Ajo for non-emergency care, it would help reduce the wait times at the emergency rooms.
- > Having medical information on the refrigerator to include Name, date of birth, Important medical history, medications and allergies.
- > The two closest Fire Stations to your facility are Fire Station 15 located at 2002 S Mission, and Fire Station 18 located at 1855 W Drexel. We do free blood pressure checks at the stations during business hours. If there is an emergency please don't drive to the station, just call 911 because we might not be home.
- > The City of Tucson Fire Department does not charge for responses to your emergency, call if you need us. We also respond for lift assist.
- > Please call early if you think you have any type of stroke symptoms such as a severe headache without a history of them, confusion, one-sided weakness, slurred speech etc. There is a narrow window of time to treat these symptoms.
- > If you fall and you're on blood thinners, please pay particular attention to these stroke symptoms.
- > Desert safety Please watch the weather and expect the hot days to get hot fast don't let the cold morning fool you. If you're pricked from one of our thorny plants, please watch for signs of infection and seek medical attention. These infections can get out of hand quickly.
