





Suggestions to SUMMERIZE YOUR HOME



TURN OFF WATER

- 1. Drain pipes if possible
- 2. Shut off ALL faucets
- 3. DO NOT close or plug drains!
- 4. Pour a cup of RV antifreeze down every drain
- 5. Shut off water behind washing machine
- 6. Shut off water behind refrigerator
- 7. Shut off water to toilet and sinks
- 8. Verify/Install a shut off valve to every water source in the home

HIRE A CARETAKER

- 1. Check the home once a month
- 2. With flashlight look under sinks, around toilets and hot water tank for signs of water
- 3. Check the home within 24 hrs after storms
