## Wednesday Morning COFFEE BUZZ

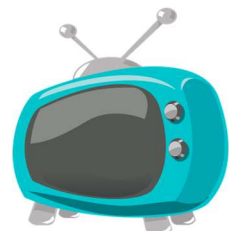
Join us for a free donut and cup of coffee in the Auditorium on Wednesday mornings. Doors open at 8:30 am and our program starts at 9:00am.

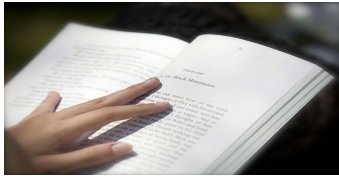

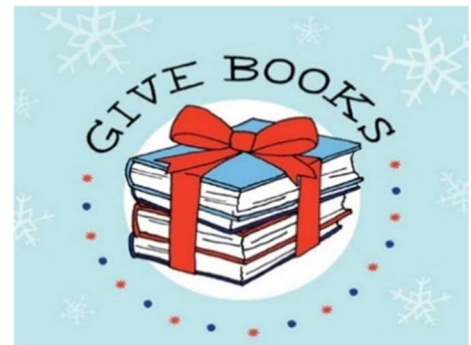

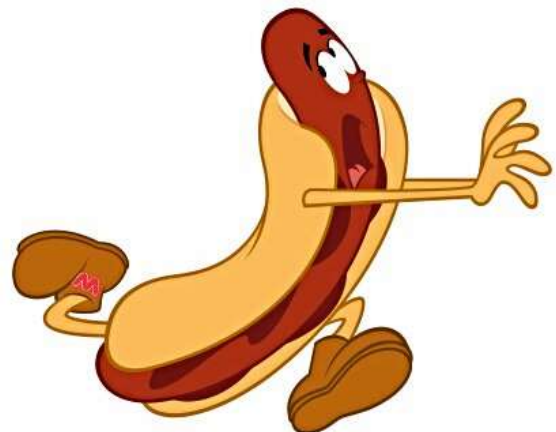

## Safety from Wildlife

As the evenings cool, rattlesnakes might seek the warmth of a cozy asphalt street after sundown, and you may see or hear coyotes or javelinas.
