





Please observe the 10 MPH speed limit inside the park.




For maximum safety, carry a **flashlight** and turn it on when you are walking at night.

Stay Safe in the Heat!

- > **Drink Water:** Aim for at least 2 liters (8 cups) per day.
- > **Dress Appropriately:** Wear lightweight, light-colored clothing, a hat, or carry an umbrella. Don't forget sunscreen on exposed skin.
- > **Take It Easy:** Avoid strenuous activity. If necessary, do it in the early morning (4:00–7:00 AM during summer).
- > **Take Breaks:** Rest in a cool place whenever possible.
