## Keep Your Receipt!

*Because let's face it — life happens, and plans can change!*

### Refunds & Exchanges

Before buying your event tickets, please double-check the event name, date, and time. All sales are final, but we understand things come up, here's what you need to know:

### Events & Series Tickets

- Full refund if you let us know 7 days before the first event date
- No refunds or cancellations after the posted ticket deadline.
- Sorry, no partial refunds once the series begins.

### Lost or Stolen Tickets

- We can usually replace them **if you still have your original receipt** — just ask!

### Sold or Transferred Tickets

- If your event gets cancelled and you've passed your tickets along to a friend, **bring the ticket and original purchase receipt** to the Activity Office for a refund.

### Cancelled or Rescheduled Events

- Cancelled? Refunds will be in cash.
- Postponed, rescheduled, or moved? Your tickets are still good — no need to do a thing!
- Refunds are available with your receipt if you can't make the new date.
- Check with the Activity Office for updates — we'll do our best to keep everyone in the loop.

### Shuttle Trips

- No refunds or cancellations within 7 (seven) days of the trip.
- Trips need a minimum of 6 (six) reserved seats to roll out!

### Charter Trips

- No refunds or cancellations after the posted ticket deadline.

## IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- No refunds after an event has taken place.
- Bring your **ticket and receipt** for any refund requests.
  - Refunds can't be issued without your original receipt.
- Most refunds (except Season Concerts) are cash only.
- Each refund request is managed case by case, we'll do our best to help.

### **Activity/Fitness Levels for RCW Shuttle/Charter Trips**

#### **L1 - Sightseer (Easy)**

Relax and enjoy the ride! Minimal walking, primarily on flat surfaces with possibly a few steps with handrails. With little to no standing, there is time to sit back, take in the sights, and snap some photos. Great for those who want comfort with a touch of adventure.

#### **L2 - Explorer (Moderate)**

A little more movement, a little more adventure! Expect walking 1-3 miles, stairs with or without handrails, or uneven ground, but with opportunity to rest. Perfect for folks ready to stretch their legs while still keeping things fun and doable.

#### **L3 - Adventurer (Hard)**

For the spirited traveler! Longer, 1-2 hours of walking with breaks, hills and inclines, uneven terrain, significant stair climbing with or without handrails and/or lots of standing time may be involved. Bring your sturdy shoes and energy, this one's for those who love to dive headfirst into the full experience.
